Council member LeFever reported for Public Safety; held at 6:30 pm; prior to council meeting to meet with Fire Chief Butch Fidler to discuss extending the mile parameter for residency requirement from 3 to 5 miles for volunteer firefighters. This change will require a change to current Ordinance. Also discussed the use of blue lights; which requires an application process required by state law.

LeFever explained why she voted no; stating if we keep the debt service levy where it is now; we are locking in all property tax payers for a 34cent tax for the next ten years. If we include the assessments as they stand now; the debt service levy after the 15-16 budget will be lowered for all property tax payers and the GO bond can be shortened by several years for all property taxpayers. By state code we are allowed to assess up to 25% of the assessed property value based on the value of the property after improvements. We have done neither of these; as it stands now the assessments are at 12%(down from the original 14%) of the assessed value before improvements. If we were voting to lower the assessments but keeping it within the point where the debt service levy and the shortened time of the GO bond can be a benefit to all property owners; I would be in favor of that. I am on this council to represent all property owners; all Glenwood residents; not just a few at the expense of the many.
