Discussed possible purchase of ambulance for the City, projected completion date is 36 months, estimated \$389,829.00 including power cot, Osage Ambulance recommended due to transferable warranty, this can be ordered now and can be canceled at any time with no charges to the City, payment would not be due until ambulance is built and ready for delivery. Chief Gray would like to use funds from EMS billing to save for the purchase, will look for grants & other funding options.
